Members of all three Valdosta area Rotary Clubs helped the Group Study Exchange (GSE) team visiting from District 3180 in the Indian state of Karnataka.

The team was greeted by Assistant Governor Bob Harrison (Valdosta North) and **Keith Barrett** at the Holiday Inn in Waycross on Thursday after lunch. During our travel to Valdosta, we had a good conversation about the foods that they have tried and places they have been to see since their arrival. We checked in the Wingate Hotel (thanks to manager **Mason Caracciolo** for the hospitality and to **Tim Mabe** for the welcome gifts!). Part of the group went to the Turner Center for the Arts and part of the team went to tour with **Bo Broadfoot**. Bo showed off some very high-tech dental equipment. Dr. Karthik Shetty was most complimentary of Bo's work and willingness to work us in between his patients so he could see that dentists work the same busy schedule with several procedures going at the same time. On Thursday evening, **District Director Bill Booth**, Patricia & **Dennis Marks**, and Marty Rodgers (President Elect, Valdosta North) hosted the team for dinner at *Passage to India*. The group commented on Friday morning how much they enjoyed the meal and that the spices had been kicked up several notches as it would have been cooked at home.

Friday started with Jeff Moxley (President, Valdosta North) and Keith Barrett in the role of chauffeurs for very busy day. The first stop was the County Extension Office to which we were greeted by Melinda Miller, who provide introductions and midmorning snack of pastries and fresh strawberries. Calvin Wills gave a presentation on growing organic peanuts and the process of certification of organic crops. Jake Price discussed pesticides and proper handling. Next a walking tour of downtown Valdosta, of which Jeff shared his knowledge of the renovation of downtown. With lunch at the Bistro, Marty Rogers took over for Jeff. After lunch, Mr. Warren gave us a tour of Langdale Farms fishery to see how they raise tilapia. Keshava was impressed with the small ecological impact raising the fish had. Our final stop was a tour of the new scale house, a LEED designed facility at Veolia Environmental. Nandakumar (Nandoo) and Keith discussed the design of the project including the materials and green components. Dinner was hosted by Steve Barnes (President, Valdosta Sunrise), his daughter Katelyn, and Keith Barrett at Mori Japanese Steakhouse. It was described as a "Symphony of Food" by the group. The chef really put on a show and made sure the meat did not have any contact with the vegetables.

On Saturday, Sheryl Dasinger (Valdosta North), Bob & Leah Harrison, and **Dennis Marks** gave the GSE team a tour of Valdosta State University, meeting with faculty and students in various departments of professional interest to members of the team – Biology, Chemistry, Nursing, Special Education, and Music. Dr. Srikousthubha was especially interested in medical education. The team had lunch in the new Student Union (thanks, **Rich Yokeley!**) and dinner at the home of Dr. & Mrs. Ashok Kumar, with Patricia & **Dennis Marks**, Betty & **Bob Moon** (who was born in India), and John & **Chris Roan**. To cap off the evening, the Harrisons and Markses hosted the team at a performance by the Valdosta Symphony Orchestra, particularly enjoyed by musician Ramyashree.

On Sunday, after an exchange of club banners and regional gifts, Steve Barnes and **Dennis Marks** conveyed the team to the home of Past District Governor Leon Benefield in Tifton to continue their tour of Rotary District 6920.

By all accounts, the District Conference was a rousing success. Total attendance was 453, which is a modern record for District 6920. The speakers were entertaining, inspiring and informative. Cliff Dochterman, Past RI President and John Kenny's representative to our conference, challenged us with his topic of "When Did We Become a Rotarian" and kept the audience laughing with his Rotary humor. It was quite an honor to have a Past RI President assigned to our annual conference. Dr. Levey of Emory University gave us hope that progress is being made in the battle against

Alzheimer's disease. And, who could forget Coach Bill Curry's kickoff address relating to how lessons learned on the football field were applicable to life's situations?

Marsha Hyer's Awards Program set a new standard for conference events. From the grand entrance on the red carpet to the PDG chorus line, we were regaled with glitz and glamour. "Rotary Has Talent" showcased the performing skills of several District Rotarians. The comment was made afterward that the next time the PDG chorus took the stage, they should write the letters "L" and "R" on the tops of their shoes!

Once again, we experienced last minute on-site registrations. In spite of extending the on-line registration to less than a week before the conference, there were a number of walk ups, particularly on Saturday. You never want to turn anyone away, however, last minute ticket purchases make it impossible to adequately plan for the proper number of meals.

The District Trip Raffle Fund Raiser grossed approximately \$92,000. Final results are being tabulated and should be available in a few days. The trips were enthusiastically accepted by the four winners drawn at the Conference. Those winners were Hawaii - Amy Hightower; Bermuda - Jeff Jones; San Francisco - Joe McGovern and Santa Fe - Brooke Pridmore.

The net proceeds from the raffle will be available to individuals or clubs who agree to a matching contribution to the Annual Programs Fund, PolioPlus or the GRSP Endowment. All contributions must be made during the current Rotary year, which ends June 30. Should there be fewer requests than dollars available, the district will contribute the balance and will hold the contribution in district points for later distribution to clubs/individuals.

Clubs receiving awards at the conference are listed in the following tabulation. As usual, there was plenty of heated competition. Every club that received an award is to be congratulated. The Governor's Award of Excellence for outstanding achievement in the areas of Membership, Rotary Foundation Support, Literacy and Conference Attendance was presented to eleven district clubs. These were Brunswick, Downtown Statesboro, Dublin, St. Simons Island, Sandersville, Savannah South, Savannah Sunrise, Savannah West, Skidaway Island, Waynesboro and Valdosta.

Of particular significance was the Service Above Self Award presented to Skidaway Island Rotarian Wells Hood. The Rotary Board created this award to specifically recognize those Rotarians who truly embody Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self." This is Rotary International's highest honor to bestow on a Rotarian. Each year only 150 Rotarians can be selected. In Rotary year 2009-10 there were 387 nominees. Congratulations Wells!

We also tip our hats to the House of Friendship and Silent Auction teams. Meredith Deal and her Brunswick Rotary assistants utilized the large space of Caldwell Hall to provide all clubs with plenty of room for their displays. Ted and Charolette Thompson of Sandersville Rotary once again demonstrated their skills in obtaining sought-after auction items. Final accounting for the silent auction is still underway. However, we expect the net to the conference to be in the neighborhood of \$5,000. The House of Friendship was certainly the social center of convention activities.
