

# Today's Program



#### CUEE

Education is at the forefront of nearly every political debate these days and it's no different in South Georgia. Community Unification for Educational Excellence, Inc. (CUEE) was founded in 2009 by a group of local business leaders committed to improving education in order to improve our economy. Students must know how to compete on a global level to achieve success, but low graduation rates and standardized test scores are keeping them behind.



Georgia ranks 46th out of 50 states when it comes to how well our students are learning. The fact that schools in Valdosta and Lowndes County are "average" in a state ranked in the bottom tier doesn't provide a very good outlook for our children.

#### **CUEE Believes Our Students Deserve Better**

To begin, CUEE, Inc. will form a committee of teachers, administrators, parents, and concerned citizens to create a plan of what reform will look like for our community. This plan will be presented in a public forum in Spring 2011 and will serve as a suggested vision of the ideal school system in Valdosta and Lowndes County.

CUEE has also begun efforts to get a referendum on the ballot for the November 2011 Valdosta City election to unify our two existing school systems. As one school system, it will be simpler to adapt curriculum and more productive policies, and work as one community toward providing our children with a world-class learning environment.

CUEE's mission as a non-profit organization is to support our local schools, improve the quality of education, and provide businesses and corporations with a talented workforce.

#### The Referendum to Unify Our School Systems



The referendum to unify the Valdosta and Lowndes County school systems is CUEE's primary project at this time. Within CUEE is the Committee for a Referendum on School System Unification. This committee is charged with getting school system unification on the ballot in Valdosta's City Election in November 2011.

Getting on the ballot will be no small feat. They must first get a petition signed by 25% of registered Valdosta City voters - roughly 7,500 signa-

tures. They will only have a 60-day window in which to collect the signatures. The committee is currently working to educate our community on the advantages of a unified school system. They are offering to speak to any civic organization, community group, or church congregation who is willing to listen. The more they reach, the more signatures they hope to collect.

With citizen support to bring school system unification to a vote, the referendum will appear on the ballot. Valdostans will then cast their vote based on the following question: "Shall the City of Valdosta public school system and the Lowndes County public school system be consolidated by amending the City of Valdosta charter to abolish the City of Valdosta's public school system and making the City of Valdosta public school system a part of the Lowndes County public school system?"

By a majority vote of YES, the Valdosta City School System will no longer have a charter. According to Georgia law, the county public school system will then be responsible for educating the children who live here. However, CUEE's intent is to assist in creating a new school system that will include leadership from Valdosta and other communities within our county. Not only will we have a unified school system, we'll be a unified community and have a unified vision of providing the best possible education for our children.
